OTTAWA BOC AND ASSOCIATES SPRING RETREAT

The Ottawa BOC hosted its annual newal of commitments and the spring retreat at Galilee Centre on Eucharistic celebration led by June 16. There were 19 in attendance, including 3 Oblates, 13 Associates and 3 Affiliates from the Ottawa, Arnprior and Westport areas. Richard Kelly organized the gathering and Roy Boucher was the animator for the day. Each year, participants look forward to the spiritual growth, faith sharing and community renewal that occurs here, not to mention the superb hospitality and peaceful setting provided by Galilee.

We experienced this retreat as a Eucharistic event. The morning prayer and guided contemplation led by Roy was the Liturgy of the Word. At day's end we moved directly into the offertory, the reRichard. Everyone enjoyed a silent lunch and the celebratory dinner together.

The guided contemplation was focused on Mark 10:46-52 where Jesus heals the blind Bartimaeus (also told in Luke 18:35-43 and Matt. 20:29-34). Bartimaeus scolded by the crowd to remain quiet, persists in crying out loudly, "Jesus, Son of David! Take pity on me." Jesus finally calls him over and asks "What do you want me to do for you?" "Teacher, I want to see again" says Bartimaeus. Jesus responds, "Then see. Go, your faith has made you well." Bartimaeus is able to see, begins following Jesus, giving thanks to

God. The crowd witnesses it all and praises God as they too could now see.

We were divided into groups and asked to visualize being Jesus, Bartimaeus or a member of the crowd. Using our imagination we reflected on what our personal experience was on that day. The sharing was rich, insightful and deep. We learned more about ourselves, each other, our faith and discipleship. We discussed how Bartimaeus was a "perfect disciple" that day and was healed by his faith alone. "Seeing" is a metaphor here for "seeing" the truth of believing in Christ and the Good News.

We loved the sacred scripture basis of the day, the guided contemplation, the silent time to reflect and the encouragement for each to share without "fixing" the other. Several said that it is through faith sharing gatherings like this that our spiritual growth needs are being met.

Richard Kelly celebrated a beautiful Eucharist with the 1860 Royal Oak tree as the backdrop. Three Associates renewed their annual commitment: Jane McDonald, Suzanne Massie-Manchevsky and David Morgan. The three new Affiliates are Karen Ann McKinna and Marie Morgan of Arnprior and Renée Liss-Siraco of Ottawa.

One disappointment was the fewer number of Oblates who are able to attend this year. In discussing this we felt that the "tipping" point may have been reached and that Associates can take leadership in organizing similar faith sharing and hospitality events and invite all community members. Perhaps this will help address the needs of aging Oblates and Associates who may not be able to attend particular gatherings for health reasons. There is also a desire to



establish an Arnprior Associates group to reduce the amount of travel, particularly in winter months.

Suzanne's husband, Norman, joined us for dinner. Maureen Pinsonneault, HOMI, said grace and we enjoyed a delicious dinner and carrot cake in honour of Erin Ryan's birthday. Eugene de Mazenod, a broken, but holy man, received the original inspiration for the Oblate Charism. For the charism to make sense in 2017, we must return once more to our original inspiration. Our retreat this fall will invite a rediscovery of the core of our Charism—a new incarnation for the present moment.

Accompanied by God's word, and by the Founder and his first companions, Fr. Bonga Majola, OMI, will invite us to consider how we might re-propose the charism as witnesses for today's world. renew our commitments as sons and daughters of St. Eugene.
