Changing Times at the Qu'Appelle House of Prayer

There have been many changes at Qu'Appelle House of Prayer over the years, most especially with core community personnel. Now well into our 23^{rd} year, these transitions continue. In June 2014, Catherine Barnsley and partner Rev. Rick McCorrister moved in – "for a year or more;" beginning this March 1, they will be leaving for extended personal time, which they have not enjoyed in many years.

This imminent change has also given us the occasion to take a "pause" during the first six months of 2018 – a pause, not a sabbatical. This time of intentional rest, when we will be better able to live the life we long to live, will be a graced time to discern the coming years of QHP, together with several others committed to this way of life and ministry. That reflection has already begun with Potter's House BOC, Saskatchewan District Community and key others. Numerous people – couples and individuals – have recently asked to be considered, whether to help out as needed, and significantly, to be part of the core community life and work as live-in persons. Within the next few months, a focus weekend with selected participants is being planned to revisit the Vision Statement and to reconsider how it might best be realized during the next 3-5 years. More than ever, seekers from so many backgrounds are coming to the House of Prayer. How do we best continue to welcome? What new form(s) might be emerging from what has been for well over 20 years? How might we best care both for ourselves and for our valued property as it too ages along with us? What new horizons of leadership and new options for volunteer help and shared life might be emerging? In what substantive ways might oversight and responsibility for the House of Prayer be widened?

During these six months, we will welcome resident guests less frequently, and more often those who come here to pray with us and to celebrate Eucharist on a regular basis. Resident part-time volunteers have already been arranged during this time. Other usual ministries, such as responding to local and other pastoral needs, initiatives for interfaith work and so forth, will also continue. Several administrative "upgrades" will also take place to assist evolving eventual succession plans.

Questions, suggestions and participation are wholeheartedly welcoming, particularly from the Oblate Associates and vowed Oblates in OMI Lacombe Province.
