As in years past, we will gather to remember the deceased members of our Oblate family at mass on Wednesday afternoon and enjoy toasting and


roasting the Jubilarians on Thursday, starting with Mass at 4:15, followed by dinner at 5:30 and Gaudeamus at 7:00 p.m.
