

#### Mon Journal: Journal and Memoir of Father Léon Doucet (by Alfred Groleau, OMI)

Mon Journal: The Journal and Memoir of Father Léon O.M.I. 1868-1890

Transcribed and translated by Bronwyn Evans; edited by Mario Giguère and Bronwyn Evans.

I attended the book launch of this publication by the Historical Society of Alberta at Audrey's Bookstore in the evening of November 20th. Though this book has an interest not for the general public but for a particular readership, the event was well attended. The store had set up some dozens of chairs among its book shelves and I had to take a seat in the front row because all others were taken.



Bronwyn discovered the writings of Father Doucet when she was a summer tour guide at the Father Lacombe Chapel on Mission Hill in St. Albert. She undertook to decipher his manuscript that had been compiled from notebooks he carried in his mission travels. She also translated the journal into English and Mario Giguère contributed to the editing. In a clear and succinct presentation, Bronwyn situated the journal in its historical context and chose a few excerpts that illustrated its descriptive qualities. In his presentation Mario spoke about 'les missions ambulantes', the traveling missions, whereby the missionaries traveled to different native communities for the purpose of evangelizing and catechizing. It appears to me that the methodology would have been inspired by the missions preached by the Oblates of Provence, though adapted very much to the Canadian circumstances. Lacombe, Doucet and Scollen were its main agents.

Both of the editors are recent post graduates from the University of Alberta. Mario Giguère is an alumnus of the Faculté St. Jean and proud of this fact.

This publication is one of about twenty produced by the Historical Society of Alberta. It is of great interest to historians, valued as a genuine historical document on the great transition that happened in Alberta at the end of 19th century – in itself, a positive testimony to the presence of Oblates in this land at that time.
