

Father Thomas Bilodeau, OMI passed away on February 5, 2019 at his home at Foyer Lacombe, St. Albert, AB at the age of 91. Son of Thomas Bilodeau and Regina Moreau, he was born in Edmonton, AB on July 10, 1927.

Fr. Alfred Groleau, OMI celebrated a funeral mass on February 11, 2019 at St. Albert Parish; interment followed at the Oblate Plot of the St. Albert Catholic Cemetery.

Thomas pronounced his First Vows with the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate in 1950 and was ordained a priest on July 8, 1956 in Rome. Fr. Tom exercised his ministry in Edmonton at Collège St. Jean, Ste Anne Parish and on Whyte Ave as animator of Listener's Corner. He retired at Foyer Lacombe in 2012. May he rest in peace.
