We recently concluded our Summer Still Retreat with Fr. Ron Rolheiser. As in the past couple of years, we have organized this event in 2 parts. The Public Lecture component occurred on the Monday evening as 189 participants received Fr. Ron's presentation entitled "Recognizing God's Voice – The Cadence and Tone of the Voice of the Good Shepherd". Fr. Ron assured his listeners that they can recognize and discern God's voice even as we are surrounded by



many other voices in our busy and wired world. The presentation was very well received and our guests felt nurtured and encouraged by Fr. Ron's wisdom and insight.

The event continued through the rest of the week as Fr. Ron presented the second part of the retreat entitled "Prayer – Our Deepest Longing". Fr. Ron provided participants with the encouragement that we embrace our need for prayer and solitude and reminded us of the many obstacles that confront us in this. He went on to define prayer and to elaborate on the distinctions that are part of our understanding of how this all fits together, especially in our efforts to 'Read the signs of our times". Further, the components of formal prayer and the framework of Priestly or Liturgical Prayers mandate us through baptism to pray for the world through the church.

The retreat ended with Fr. Ron sharing some mystical images for prayer and offering us some commandments for the long haul that help us maintain our persistence and our perspective. The retreat was sprinkles as well a number of community building events that our guests very much enjoyed. Our annual Barry Luft concert on Tuesday evening was extended to include a delightful wine and cheese social. We added again this year an optional opportunity for retreatants to take in Shakespeare on the Saskatchewan's "As You Like It", which was a hit.
