From St. Eugene de Mazenod

Writing in his diary from Saint Sulpice in January 1812 Eugene wants to ensure that his "deeds will speak more loudly than my words".

"...I will submit to what seems to be the design of Providence in my regard; and in order not to render unfruitful the ministry for which it destines me, I will strive to live in such a way that my deeds will speak more loudly than my words and suggestions.

"With that in view, I will try with God's help to renew myself in the spirit of the priesthood, and my first step will be to impress upon myself that the priesthood is a state of perfection, which demands of those who have the happiness to be invested with it a scrupulous fidelity to the least movements of the Holy Spirit [...] in everything



seeking God alone, his glory, the salvation of souls and our progress in the ways of perfection." (103:XV in Oblate Writings)

Notes from the New Year's Day – the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God - Homily of Pope Francis

"...we begin the year by celebrating Our Lady, the woman who wove the humanity of God.

"...In drawing close to Mary, the Church discovers herself, she finds her centre and her unity. The enemy of our human nature, the devil, seeks instead to divide, to highlight differences, ideologies, partisan thinking and parties. But we do not understand the Church if we regard her by starting with structures, programmes and trends, ideologies and functions. We may grasp something, but not the heart of the Church. Because the Church has a mother's heart. And we, as her sons and daughters, invoke today the Mother of God, who gathers us together as people of believers. O Mother, give birth to hope within us and bring us unity. Woman of Salvation, to you we entrust this year. Keep it in your heart. We acclaim you, the Holy Mother of God."
