March 19 - Mazenodian Family Oraison

Join us in this focus on our monthly Mazenodian Family Oraison with a short reflection from Zuzana Laskova, an Oblate Associate in the Czech Republic posted on Evangelium live - Sunday March 19's Gospel of John 9:1-41

"He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed, and came back able to see."

I always used to wish, when something was bothering me a lot, Jesus would come to set me free with a great glory, a miracle or some heroic gesture. I expected it from Him because He is the Lord of lords and the King of kings. But I never did... Jesus, who "healed many people of sicknesses and diseases and of evil spirits" (Luke 7:21), completely ignored me. That's what I thought for a while.

I have been doing a spiritual journal for quite a while now. There are things in it that I have brought to God or that He has brought to me. When I picked it up after a long time and had some time to read it back, I found that incredible miracles had happened in my life that I had not even noticed. I read through notes that no longer concerned me at all, problems I no longer dealt with, pains that no longer bothered me. They were healed, I just did not notice... It was done unobtrusively, without much hype and Jesus' bow waiting for applause. Rather, it was a process that didn't lack mud, dirt, tears, uncertainty, inconvenience, or a good expenditure of energy and a chunk of my effort and will that Jesus invited me to do, just as

he invited the blind man to go to Siloam to wash. He doesn't want us to be passive bystanders, but to be full partners in all he does.

That's Jesus' style of healing... personally, together, intimately, uniquely, permanently. I try to think of this gospel now every time I am hurting about something, and I remind myself that it is in my moments of most intense pain that Jesus is perhaps closest to me, touching me, anointing me with healing balm, and doing everything He can to save me.

The charism embodied and expressed by a founder or founding community has often "spun out" and seeds have been planted for the foundation of not just one, but often many, religious communities. In addition, these communities have welcomed lay missionaries, associates, co-workers and other lay partners who share the spirit, the spirituality, the outlook and the mission of the founder and those who have followed in their footsteps.
