



The end of the nice weather, the end of November and the end of the liturgical year are all coming together as we send out another Sights and Sounds. We have been blessed with wonderful autumn weather and subtle reminders that God walks among us.

We began November with celebrations of our holy friends, the Saints and of those friends we have lost and heaven has gained. Our November continued with the celebration of Fr. Joe’s work as chaplain at St. Anne’s and then his move to St Albert which took place on November 10. We had a wonderful potluck supper at St. Philip Neri, some roasts and toasts of Joe and a prayer ritual reminding us that as Missionary Oblates we are continually being sent and welcomed. Joe seems to be settling in well at Foyer Lacombe. He was welcomed warmly by all and especially by Archbishop Sylvain Lavoie and Bro. Don Claerhout.

On November 3 we celebrated the launch of Fr. Ron Rolheiser’s newly published book, “Insane for the Light”, the third book in his ‘spirituality of aging’ trilogy. As I write this, Fr. Ron Rolheiser has begun treatments for his cancer. During his treatment, Ron has lessened his workload but he continues to teach his classes. Yesterday, Br. Harley had a port surgically installed to deliver the chemo without a poke each time. Harley will begin his chemo treatment on Monday, December 1st. Fr. Richard Doll is undergoing surgery, and we are waiting to hear the results.

Throughout the course of our lives, we are made to wait, we wait for news and information, we wait in traffic, we wait in lines, we wait for people to respond to us, and we wait to grow up. Throughout our life we get lots of practice just waiting. Despite that practice, few of us perfect the virtue of waiting. Advent is about waiting. Blessed are those people among us who learn to wait.

As we enter this great season of waiting, we are reminded that we are waiting to celebrate the historical coming of Jesus and we are waiting to celebrate the return of Jesus at the end of time.
